The report follows an inspection on June 27 and 28 at which the inspectors found the school to be good in all areas.

In the previous inspection in 2015, the school was given a 'requires improvement' grad-ing. However, the 2017 report stated that the school had been "transformed" by the head-teacher Serena Hemmings, who arrived just before the 2015 inspection, and that her "compelling positive vision for an inclusive school," is shared by governors, staff, parents and pupils

The inspection found strong moral values underpinning the school and a real understanding of what pupils need to learn and develop. This has been reflected in pupils' behaviour, progress and in their outlook on life, and the
