## Farnham Lions Golf Day supports Cancer Care.

When asked what The Fountain centre is, many readers wouldn't know. The centre is a special place within the St Luke's Cancer centre at The Royal Surrey County Hospital in Guildford, providing information support, counselling and a wide range of complementary therapies to cancer patients, their carers, relatives and friends, those bereaved and hospital staff.

Many of the participants recalled that it wasn't easy to score, as the overnight rain took the run off the ball, nonetheless, Paul Sopp came in with a very creditable 40 points to win the individual prize, from Lee Harding in 2<sup>nd</sup> place with 37 points and R Rowlett 3<sup>rd</sup> with 36points.
