The following day members presented a cheque for £3000 to the Farnham based 40 Degreez Youth project at their official opening of their revamped facility. 40 Degreez provides a venue for all young people in the age range 10 to 25 years to meet in a safe and informal environment, supporting a variety of leisure, social and advisory activities. The facility is also used by a number of agencies who provide support across a wide range of issues.

On Friday 4<sup>th</sup> November, we were delighted to be able to present to Challengers the proceeds from

our 20th annual Golf Day held in August. A record 33 teams enjoyed a fantastic day of golf and fun on what as an exceptionally hot day followed by cooling drinks, an excellent lunch and an auction.
